Made with a slim profile and a wide nose, Syncros' FL saddle has the comfort that trail riders need at a weight they want. The saddle comes with titanium rails, a composite shell, and a leather cover with Aramid side panels. It has a firm feel that requires some break-in but once it fits you then it's comfortable. We really like the extra support the nose profile provides when sliding forward on climbs and the contoured center section relieves pressure on long rides.
